BHDDA/OROSC Response to the Opioid Crisis

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Opioid STR Grant

The MDHHS was awarded a 2-year State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis (STR) Grant from SAMHSA in April 2017 for \$16,372,680 per year.

The purpose of this grant is to increase access to treatment, reduce unmet treatment need, and reduce opioid overdose related deaths from Opioid Use Disorders (OUDs).


Opioid STR Grant Overview

This grant can be used for interventions related to:

- Prevention
- Treatment
- Recovery

Prevention Initiatives

- Improve Michigan's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (MAPS)
 - NarxCare
 - Assess and manage patient risk
 - Share information
 - Comply with regulations
 - Rollout expected in January 2018
 - For prescribers and dispensers



Prevention Initiatives (con't)

- Develop a statewide awareness campaign
 - Uses social media, music streaming sites, radio, and television
- Support Tribal led initiatives
 - Media campaigns, naloxone training
- Improve the availability of Naloxone
 - Red Project: training on how to use Narcan kits, and how to obtain kits





Prevention Initiatives (con't)

- Enhance opioid prescribing practices
 - MI OPEN II: creating data informed guidelines and CME's for dental and surgical procedures
- Support for prevention interventions
 - Strengthening Families Program Iowa
 Model: 7-module family intervention





Treatment Initiatives


- Expand the availability and use of Medication Assisted
 Treatment
 - Incentivize current medication assisted treatment (MAT) guidelines
 - Incentivize use of Evidence Based Practices (EBPs)
 - Cover uninsured/under-insured patients
 - Reduce transportation barriers
 - Support jail-based MAT
 - Michigan Opioid Collaborative (MOC): Provide tele-mentoring and a consultant service to increase access to MAT

Treatment Initiatives (con't)

- Increase Tribal led interventions
 - Establish provider network for patients with opioid use disorder
 - Cover uninsured/underinsured patients
 - Identify training needs
 - Provide training and technical assistance
- Support of law enforcement
 - Angel Project: Narcan kits for Michigan State Police

Treatment Initiatives (con't)

- Provide a new model for the prisoner re-entry population with co-occurring Opioid Use and Mental Health Disorders
 - MISSION MI-REP
 - Clinical team with Case Manager and Peer Specialist
 - Help with transition from incarceration
 - Uses several evidence based practices
 - Critical Time Intervention
 - Dual Recovery Therapy
 - Peer Support
 - Vocational Support
 - Trauma Informed Care



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Treatment/Recovery Initiatives

- Expand the use of Peers/Recovery Coaches in Medication Assisted Treatment Programs
 - Medication Assisted Recovery Supports (MARS) Training to peers
- Expand the use of Recovery Coaches in health care settings
 - Project ASSERT: SBIRT for Emergency Departments

- Telehealth support to Medication Assisted Treatment programs
- Evaluation
