- I. **Welcome and Introductions** – Mark Lewis called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

- III. **Administrative Updates** – Brenda Stoneburner
 - A. 1115 Waiver – MDHHS is still in conversation with CMS for the 1115 Waiver.
 - B. Section 298 Initiatives Update – The Section 298 Initiative is a statewide effort to improve the coordination of physical health services and behavioral health services in Michigan. This initiative is based upon Section 298 in the Public Act 268 of 2016. MDHHS has had an open communication on the process. Within the last year, there have been weekly updates posted. Brenda mentioned one of the most helpful items on the website is a crosswalk of recommendations from the C.A.R.E.S. Task Force, the MIPAD Initiative, Section 298 Initiative, and the Diversion Council. All 4 groups have been doing a lot of work within the past year or two. The crosswalk shows how those 4 different groups overlap in some of those recommendations. Recently there have been two updates:

- E. Behavior Supports Committee – MDHHS is sponsoring 2 trainings on how to write behavioral treatment plans from functional analysis processes through the committee.  - a. IDDT - IDDT and ACT integration continues. This is going well. Reviews are continuing, and the Department is reviewing trends. The Annual MIFAST Training is June 18th & 19th and another one is in October. The second day is inter-rater reliability training. This training is for ACT, IDDT, ACT/IDDT, Behavioral Treatment, DBT, Motivational Interviewing, LOCUS, and Trauma reviewers. IDDT and ACT/IDDT reviewers need to attend both days.

- e. Trauma MIFAST – The annual MIFAST training is June 18th & 19th and another one is in October. The second day is inter-rater reliability training. This training is for ACT, IDDT, ACT/IDDT, Behavioral Treatment, DBT, Motivational Interviewing, LOCUS, and Trauma reviewers. Trauma reviewers only need to attend the 1st half of day 1. There were a series of Trauma Informed Care MIFAST reviews done across the U.P. They are currently doing some reviews in Macomb and Wayne counties. There are follow-up consultations in July.
- J. LOCUS – Jasmin White gave an update on the LOCUS MIFAST reviews. They have twelve new reviewers trained and ready for FY19. Looking at coordinating with the regions. They have starting to collect data on trends, gaps, productivity, numbers of adults served, and location then they breakdown dimensions and scores. They have regional leads identified and will be having phone conferences twice a year. The first one is set for July 31, 2018. The annual MIFAST training is June 18th & 19th and another one is in October. The second day is inter-rater reliability training. This training is for ACT, IDDT, ACT/IDDT, Behavioral Treatment, DBT, Motivational Interviewing, LOCUS, and Trauma reviewers. LOCUS reviewers only need to attend day 1.
